Purpose: To provide education and experience in the care of patients in an outpatient sports medicine setting.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

1. Evaluate patients with acute sports injuries, formulate a differential and definitive diagnosis, and create a management plan for these patients including triage, emergency care, stabilization, and transportation. *Year 4 Objective:* 1, 3, 4, 10, 14; EPA #1, 2, 3, 10; Competencies: 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4, 3.5.1

2. Evaluate patients with chronic sports injuries, formulate a differential and definitive diagnosis, and create a management plan for these patients.

Year 4 Objective: 1, 3, 4, 14; EPA#1, 2, 3; Competencies: 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4, 3.5.2

3. Perform skills such as joint examinations, joint injections, demonstration of exercises; making recommendations for therapy and giving patient education in sports medicine at the level of an intern in residency. *Year 4 Objective: 1; EPA 1, 12; Competencies: 3.1, 3.6, 4.1, 4.4*

4. Communicate information on plans of care; to patients and clinic/training room staff.

Year 4 Objective: 6, 7; EPA9; Competencies: 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 6.2, 7.3

5. Educate training staff on the management of acutely injured athletes.

Year 4 Objective: 7, EPA 9; Competencies: 4.2, 4.4, 4.5, 7.3, 7.4

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Assigned reading, discussions and presentations to staff and preceptor on sports medicine topics assigned by the preceptor.
- 2. Participation in clinic.
- 3. Coverage of seasonal sporting events with a preceptor.
- 4. Literature review of a student and/or preceptor selected topic.
- 5. Teaching one (1) "in-service" (topic chosen by student or assigned by attending) for athletic training students, clinic staff and attending as available.
- 6. Procedural skills, and joint examination of the acute and chronic joint injuries in Sports Medicine under preceptor supervision.

Criteria for Grading: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form. (Objectives 1,2,3,4)
- 2. Evaluate by direct observation the student's ability to develop a differential diagnosis. (Objectives 1,2)
- 3. Evaluate by direct observation the student's procedural skills. (Objectives 1,2,3)
- 4. Evaluate by direct observation the student's presentation/teaching skills. (Objectives 4,5)
