Purpose: To increase the student's clinical skills and knowledge in clinical nephrology.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

1. Evaluate and manage hypertension

- 2. Describe basic fluid, electrolyte and acid/base metabolism
- 3. Evaluate and manage acute renal failure
- 4. Describe the evaluation and management of chronic renal failure including dialysis and transplantation

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Work-up/evaluation of hospitalized patients
- 2. Evaluation of selected clinic patients
- 3. Interpretation of fluid/electrolyte and acid/base disorders from case studies
- 4. Daily hospital and consultation rounds
- 5. Review of assigned readings plus core readings in a basic nephrology text

Criteria for Grading: During and following this elective, the preceptor will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
- 2. Review consultative dictations and daily progress notes for completeness, timeliness, and demonstration of student knowledge of pathophysiologic processes in renal disease.
- 3. Assess the student's knowledge of clinical nephrology from discussions of informal case studies and discussion of the basic concepts of acid/base and fluid/electrolyte metabolism.
- 4. Review the student's performance of assigned readings.
- 5. Directly observed the student's ability to appropriately communicate in a "360" fashion.
- 6. Following student completion of the elective, the preceptor will complete the senior student elective evaluation form and submit it to the campus office (note: to be given credit for this elective the student must perform at a satisfactory or higher level in discussions and case presentations; an honors designation requires "outstanding" performance as judged by the preceptors in all areas including the use of recent reference literature for patient care and consultation notes)
