Purpose: To provide education and experience in the care of the patients requiring general internal medicine

services.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate refined skills in general history taking, physical examination, and patient management plans.
- 2. Describe the barriers and concerns that impact patient management in different community settings including prison inmates and ICU patients.
- 3. Act and function as an internal medicine resident with order counter signature.
- 4. Demonstrate a level of interpretative and management skill necessary for the care of internal medicine patients that is appropriate for third year.
- 5. Demonstrate skills in evidence-based medicine.

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Writing histories and conducting physicals on 2-3 inpatients or outpatients per week.
- 2. Evaluation and management of active outpatients in clinic and community settings.
- 3. Oral presentation of all patients--inpatient and outpatient--to the preceptor.
- 4. Attendance at community and hospital conferences as appropriate given the student's schedule.
- 5. Review of selected references and a major medical text to provide education in evidence-based patient management.

<u>Criteria for Grading</u>: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
- 2. Directly observe and evaluate the student's ability to perform an accurate history and physical examination.
- 3. Directly observe and evaluate the student's oral presentation of patients with particular focus on the differential diagnosis.
- 4. Directly observe and evaluate the student's ability to develop and present a plan for diagnostics and therapy.
- 5. Evaluate the student's written communications including histories and physicals, progress notes, and consultations.
- 6. Evaluate the student's knowledge of internal medicine through oral and written communications by the student.
- 7. Evaluate through oral and written communications the student's ability to apply the principles of evidence-based medicine.
- 8. Evaluate through direct observation the student's "360" communication skills.
