Purpose: To provide education and experience in the care of internal medicine patients in a rural healthcare

environment.

## **Objectives:** Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Perform a detailed history with appropriate organization of written material and oral presentation.
- 2. Perform a thorough physical examination.
- 3. Interpret laboratory and x-ray data in the context of the patient's general medical condition.
- 4. Manage common medical inpatient problems: e.g. myocardial infarction, heart failure, COPD, community acquired and nosocomial infections, principles of antibiotic therapy, care of the geriatric patient, and standard work-up of hematological/oncological conditions.
- 5. Manage common outpatient chronic disorders such as hypertension, diabetes, thyroid disease, depression and anxiety; and perform health maintenance examinations and office cancer screening procedures.
- 6. Discuss the scope of internal medicine in a rural setting including the art of triage and the patient/physician relationship.

## **Instructional Activities:** During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Didactic sessions daily pertaining to the objectives above along with the student's choice of topics.
- 2. EKG interpretation sessions.
- 3. Didactic sessions on blood banking, transfusion reactions, and principles of culture and sensitivity testing.
- 4. The completion of histories and physicals on 2-3 patients per week.
- 5. Preceptor conferences with the student providing feedback in areas of weaknesses and strengths and then after student self-reflection and assessment, the preceptor will help student develop a strategy for improvement where needed.

## **Criteria for Grading**: During and following this elective, the preceptor will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form
- 2. Evaluate the student's written notes regarding history and physical examinations, progress notes, and consultations.
- 3. Evaluate by direct observation the student's communication skills with the patient and the healthcare team.
- 4. Evaluate the student's development of core clinical knowledge in general internal medicine by oral discussions and written quizzes both during and following complete of the elective.
- 5. Evaluate by direct observation the student's technical skills with any procedures authorized.
