**Purpose:** To provide education and experience in the care of patients requiring internal medicine services.

## **Objectives:** Following successful completion of this elective, the student will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate core knowledge of internal medicine practices through participation in patient-centered learning.
- 2. Demonstrate the ability to participate actively in patient disease management in an established rural Internal Medicine practice.
- 3. Describe and discuss the critical elements of decision-making and communication necessary in the transfer of patients requiring care outside the community to the care of accepting physicians elsewhere.
- 4. Demonstrate an ability to interact and collaborate with other interprofessional medical personnel in the delivery of medical care.
- 5. Discuss the role of pediatrics, orthopedics, and other non-internal medicine services encountered by the rural health care professional in the care of patients.

## **Instructional Activities:** During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Functioning as an intern to evaluate, diagnose, and treat selected patients under the close supervision of the full-time medical staff with graded responsibility.
- 2. "Call" with faculty member.
- 3. Participation in Internal Medicine/Family Practice conferences, weekly "Grand Rounds," and the available CME teleconferences.
- 4. Self-study of multiple internal medicine topics.
- 5. Daily rounds on the inpatient service as well as the outpatient clinic.

## **<u>Criteria for Grading</u>**: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
- 2. Evaluate by direct observation the student's ability to perform a history and physical exam, and formulate appropriate assessment and treatment plans.
- 3. Evaluate the student's documentation in the medical record (written history and physical examinations, discharge summaries, and progress notes).
- 4. Evaluate the student's oral case presentations.
- 5. Evaluate by direct observation the student's performance in clinical skills and in procedures made available by the preceptor.
