**Purpose:** To gain education and experience in the care of patients requiring critical care services.

## **Objectives:** Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Describe a multidisciplinary approach to critical care in an ICU setting.
- 2. Participate in the care of patients admitted to a busy ICU under the direction of physicians from a broad range of specialties including anesthesiology, cardiology, cardiac surgery, pulmonary, general and trauma surgery and neurosurgery.

## **Instructional Activities:** During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Performance of the initial assessment of all ICU admissions.
- 2. Assisting the preceptors with histories, physical examinations, and consultations.
- 3. Rounding with the multidisciplinary medical care team.
- 4. Functioning as a sub-intern with assumption of increasing responsibility for patient care under the guidance of the attending physician.
- 5. Completion of a reading list with participation in small group didactic lectures.

## **<u>Criteria for Grading</u>**: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
- 2. Evaluate the student during 1:1 sessions regarding his/her understanding of physiological principles as they apply to the patients on the service.
- 3. Evaluate by direct observation the student's basic science knowledge, communication skills, and patient management skills.
