**Course prerequisites:** Phase 2 pre-requisite requirement; Pre-approval by preceptor and site is required to eliminate student overload and to provide an exceptional experience for all students.

**Purpose:** To enhance the education and acquisition of Ob/Gyn skills of students who are considering a residency in Obstetrics/Gynecology or Family Medicine.

## **Objectives:** Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate a greater knowledge of the basic practice and principles of Obstetrics/Gynecology in a clinical setting.
- 2. Demonstrate competence in the care of patients during normal labor and delivery, including fetal monitoring and episiotomy repairs.
- 3. Recognize high risk pregnancy and describe initial management steps and referral strategies.
- 4. Formulate a rational approach to the management of common obstetrical problems.
- 5. Obtain an obstetrical and gynecological history and perform breast exams, pap smears and pelvic exams.
- 6. Perform or assist in common office procedures in the evaluation and management of patients with various Ob/Gyn diagnoses.
- 7. Describe the use of ultrasound in the evaluation and management of gynecological and obstetrical patients.
- 8. Define general gynecological surgical procedures and demonstrate basic suturing skills.
- 9. Perform effective interviewing techniques, formulate care plans and interpret laboratory findings.

## **Instructional Activities:** During this elective, <u>the student</u> will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Daily participation in clinic, surgery, delivery and hospital rounds as directed by the preceptor. Attendance is mandatory.
- 2. Supplemental reading opportunities from standard textbooks and scientific articles associated with their clinical exposure in the clinic, operating room and labor and delivery or as directed by the preceptor.
- 3. Attendance at monthly Ob/Gyn grand rounds and other related Ob/Gyn meetings or conferences as are available and relevant to this elective.
- 4. Other related activities, including research or formal paper, at the discretion of the preceptor.
- 5. In-house call (preferably); to follow labor patients, attend deliveries and evaluate Emergency Room patients as directed and supervised by the attending physician.

## **<u>Criteria for Grading</u>**: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. By direct observation throughout the rotation evaluate student professionalism in attendance, attitude, participation and contribution to the health care team.
- 2. Directly observe and monitor the student's clinical skills and knowledge base during the elective period.
- 3. By direct observation evaluate the student's patient interaction, surgical techniques, and suturing abilities.
- 4. Utilize and complete the standardized University of North Dakota School of Medicine & Health Sciences (UNDSMHS) senior elective evaluation form.
