Purpose: To provide education and experience in the care of newborns.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Perform a physical examination and assessment of normal newborn as well as ill preterm and term newborns. (Competency 3.1)
- 2. Document patient encounters in the electronic health record. (Competency 3.7)
- 3. Demonstrate the principles of resuscitation and stabilization of the newborn. (Competency 3.5)
- 4. Generate common diagnostic and management problems of the ill newborn. (Competency 3.2, 3.3, 3.4)
- 5. Demonstrate appropriate fluid, electrolyte and nutritional management of both preterm and term infants. (Competency 2.2, 2.4, 2.6, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4)
- 6. Identify the expected complications of neonates born to mothers with high risk pregnancies. (Competency 2.2, 2.8)
- 7. Perform or assist with the common procedures encountered in the neonatal intensive care unit under appropriate attending supervision. (Competency 3.6)
- 8. Summarize in writing or orally information learned from assigned readings. (Competency 1.3)

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Daily patient rounds in which the student is responsible for forming appropriate assessment and care plans.
- 2. Daily discussions of specific patient problems based on the reading and instructional assignments given to the student by the preceptor
- 3. Attendance of c-section and high risk deliveries.
- 4. Common procedures performed in the setting of neonatal intensive care under the close supervision of the preceptor.
- 5. The calculation of enteral and parenteral nutritional requirements of the neonate.
- 6. Weekly core curriculum lectures.
- 7. A team approach (including family involvement) to the management of the ill neonate.

Criteria for Grading: During and following this elective, the preceptor will:

- 1. Evaluate by direct observation the quality of patient evaluations, management plans and daily notes. (Objective 1, 2, 4, 5, 6)
- 2. Evaluate by direct observation the quality of performance of the instructed procedures including resuscitation and stabilization of the newborn. (*Objective 3, 7*)
- 3. Evaluate by direct observation or review of written work the quality of oral and written presentations to the preceptor of assigned readings. (Objective 8)
- 4. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
