Call meeting to order- Dr. Donald Jurivich	Dr. Donald Jurivich, called the meeting to order at 3:04 p.m.	
Welcome- Dr. Donald Jurivich	 Dr. Jurivich shared a brief presentation about the FC Function: Fulfill Purpose Statement Oversee strategic plan LEADS: Learning, equity, affinity, discovery, and service. Recommend School-wide policy to the dean. Oversee its committees and the performance of their assigned functions. Communicate actions to all faculty. Reporting all activities and meeting minutes Dr. Donald Jurivich did an introduction. He is the department chair of geriatrics at SMHS. He is at UND 8 years. Dr. Jurivich is a practicing academic geriatrician. His clinical work is in conjunction with Sanford Health System Fargo. He is overseeing the geriatrics clinic. 	
Review/Approval of minutes: May 1, 2023.	The minutes were distributed beforehand for review.	Dr. Dennis Lutz moved to approve May 1 minutes, seconded by Dr. Cindy Flom-Meland. Motion passed unanimously.
Election of chair-elect—Dr. Jurivich	Dr. Lutz nominated Dr. Cornelius Dyke, Chair of the Department of Surgery, seconded by Dr. Schmitz. The decision passed unanimously.	

Dean Wynne's update (Dr.	Dr. David Relling, the Associate Dean for Health Sciences, shared an
Relling for Dr. Wynne)	 Classes are back in session this fall; many of the programs started a little bit earlier; the building is active; and more students are involved. The work on repatriation continues at the university and SMHS. Dr. Kenneth Ruit leads the SMHS repatriation response and policy considerations. The SMHS continues to address healthcare worker shortages. The legislator provided substantial funding to the school for that process. The advisory council is expecting a meeting and will discuss increased positions for both surgery and adult, child, and adolescent psychiatry. The strategic plan for SMHS is being developed. Dr. Schwartz will provide a report on the planning, which will be implemented in 2024. UND contracted consulting to look into salary and equity. The process takes 17 weeks, comparing salaries on a market basis and within the departments. They will review equity changes that occurred in June.
Learner mistreatment	Dr. Judy Solberg briefed the group on learning about mistreatment
reports—Dr. Judy Solberg	reports. The document was distributed to everyone on Wednesday. We have asked all administrators at SMHS to provide reports of learner mistreatment that they have, and they are not Title IX reports. We have received 19 reports. For several years, we didn't receive any. These reports include both students and residents. We had a slight uptake; some of it has to do with the availability of a mechanism to report.
	Dr. Zelewski stated that this is the result of hard work and encouragement to report and to make it a safe environment. The
	students and residents felt heard, which is why we have received reports.

Strategic Plan Update—Dr. Schwartz	Dr. Gary Schwartz, the chair of Population Health, shared an update regarding the strategic plan known as LEADS. SMHS LEADS should be in effect in 2024. LEADS stands for learning: equity, affinity, discovery, and service. The pillars have been meeting regularly as individual groups and preparing a draft document that is being reviewed during the meetings. The next meeting is on September 14 ^{th.}
