PROCEDURES

The School of Medicine and Health Sciences (SMHS) follows the University of North Dakota's policy for disclosure of non-research related conflicts of interest and conflicts of commitment, Policy stat ID 777-3069.

The University of North Dakota's policy notes that faculty and staff members with appointments of 50% or more of their primary professional commitment to the University of North Dakota, other part-time faculty members, and staff members commensurate with their appointments shall complete a conflict of interest form annually, or as needed. The SMHS both contracts with, as well as employs, key positions. SMHS has defined those applicable appointments that should be included in the list required to complete a conflict of interest form. Those individuals include employees, individuals with equal to or greater than 50% appointments, and those holding the position of dean, chair, program director, clerkship director or persons serving on key committees such as Undergraduate Medical Education Committee (UMEC), Faculty Council (FC), Phase 1 Committee and Phase 2 Phase 3 Committee (P2P3C) These committees, subcommittees, and strategic leadership positions may change over time and this listing is intended to be inclusive.
