

Policy on Circumstances Emergent and Non-Emergent Under Which Residents Provide Care to Non-Teaching Patients

A. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to define for which class of patients residents provide crosscoverage services.

B. **Application**

This guideline applies to all residents rotating at Sanford Health or the VA inpatient services.

C. Background

- 1. The Resident Review Committee (RRC) recognizes that a sponsoring institution must not place excess reliance on residents to meet service needs of the participating training sites.
- 2. This is defined under Section II-A-2-b.

D. Policy

- 1. Residents will have service responsibility limited to patients for whom the training program bears major diagnostic and therapeutic responsibility. This will include cross-coverage on those teaching services such as Hematology/Oncology and Gastroenterology.
- 2. For services that we do not bear major responsibilities, such as Surgery, Psychiatry, Orthopedics, Rehabilitation Medicine, residents will assess and treat patients under the following conditions:
 - a. When a consult from these services are directed to the general medicine service.
 - b. Under emergency situations when there is a life and death concern.
 - c. In an urgent situation where the physician of record for that patient, or his representative, has been notified, but the patient needs an assessment and monitoring in the interim.
- 3. For patients on the non-teaching medicine team and for patients of independent physicians, residents will assess and treat patients under the following conditions:
 - a. Under emergency situations where there is a life and death concern.
 - b. In an urgent situation where the physician of record for the patient, or his representative, has been notified, but the patient needs assessment and monitoring in the interim.
