HISTORY



The University of North Dakota School of Medicine & Health Sciences, founded in 1905, was a two-year school of basic medical science until 1973, when the North Dakota Legislature approved initiation of a four-year curriculum leading to the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree. The School offers a statewide, university-based, community-integrated medical education program that places an emphasis on primary care. Practicing physicians, constituting the majority of the faculty, educate medical students in clinics and hospitals throughout the state.

The primary purpose of the University of North Dakota School of Medicine & Health Sciences is to educate physicians, medical scientists, and other health professionals, and to enhance the quality of life in North Dakota. Through its federally funded Indians Into Medicine (INMED) Program, the School also seeks to address disparities in access to health care by educating American Indians as physicians and other health professionals.

The first two years of medical education are provided at the UND campus in Grand Forks. The third and fourth years consist of clinical rotations in Bismarck, Fargo, Grand Forks, and Minot. Students may elect to take the majority of their third year in rural communities through a program called ROME, Rural Opportunities in Medical Education, or the Minot Integrated Longitudinal Experience (MILE), a course of clinical training that third-year students undertake in required clerkships taught over the entire third year, in a longitudinal, integrated fashion. Medical students also have the opportunity to experience training in other parts of the country and the world through fourth-year electives. Postgraduate residency training in family medicine, geriatrics, internal medicine, general surgery, orthopedic surgery, and psychiatry, as well as a one-year transitional program, is conducted in the state's four major cities.

In addition to the medical education program, the School offers graduate study in biomedical sciences, clinical and translational science, Indigenous health, medical laboratory science, occupational therapy, physical therapy, physician assistant studies, and public health. Undergraduate study is offered in athletic training and medical laboratory science.

Even under duress, I will not use my knowledge or my skills against humanity.

I will acknowledge my limitations and my mistakes so that I may learn from them.

To uphold these responsibilities, I will maintain my own well-being and the well-being of those
close to me.

I will promote the integrity of the practice of medicine.

In the tradition of my profession, I honor all who teach me this art.

Through honest and respectful collaboration with my colleagues, I will uphold the highest standards
in the service of patients.

I will seek new knowledge, reexamine ideas and practices of the past, and teach what I have learned

Above all, the health of my patients will be my first concern.

This oath I take freely and upon my honor.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

REMEMBER: PATHOLOGISTS ALWAYS TRAVEL IN PAIRS



Walter L. Kemp, M.D., Ph.D., was born and raised in Libby, Mont., and graduated from Libby Senior High School. His mother is a native of Gladstone, N.D., and attended Minot State University. He attended Carroll College in Helena, Mont., for his undergraduate degree and Creighton University School of Medicine in Omaha, Neb., for his M.D. He completed his anatomic and clinical pathology residency training at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas, Texas (UTSW), and his forensic pathology fellowship at the Southwestern Institute of Forensic Sciences/Dallas County Medical Examiner's office, which is associated with UTSW. Dr. Kemp was an assistant professor in the UTSW Pathology Department for two years. He returned to Montana, where he was the

Deputy State Medical Examiner for 10 years, working at the Forensic Science Division. At this time, he obtained his Ph.D. in anthropology from the University of Montana in Missoula, Mont. He left Montana and took a position as associate professor in the Department of Pathology at the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences. During his five years in North Dakota (and subsequent year and a half doing remote lectures for UND), he received the Golden Apple award for "best teacher" five times from the second-year medical students and the Portrait Award for "best support" three times from the second-year medical students. In December 2020, Dr. Kemp returned to Montana, taking a position in Billings, Mont., as one of the state medical examiners, and subsequently becoming the chief medical examiner after the retirement of the past chief medical examiner in May 2022. He is a clinical associate professor of pathology at the University of Washington School of Medicine and an adjunct clinical associate professor at Rocky Vista University in Billings, Mont. When not working or teaching, Dr. Kemp enjoys listening to Iron Maiden, playing chess, golfing, reading, playing with his cats, Loki and Mochi, and watching NCIS with his wife, Kelly.
