### **LONGITUDINAL CLERKSHIPS & ELECTIVE**

- > 8 Weeks: Family Medicine
- 4 Weeks: Internal Medicine Obstetrics & Gynecology Surgery\*
- > 3 Weeks: Pediatrics
- 1 Week: Targeted Rural Health Education project (required elective)
   \*8 Weeks of Surgery available at one site

#### **HOME CAMPUS CLERKSHIPS**

- 2 Weeks: Neurology
- > 3 Weeks: Pediatrics
- 4 Weeks: Internal Medicine Obstetrics & Gynecology Surgery\*
- 6 Weeks: Psychiatry

### **ADVANTAGES**

- Continuity of learning, not changing sites allows better integration into the health care system, and more opportunities for learning
- > Better understanding of the continuity of care needed by patients, and comprehensive care given in rural locations
- More opportunities to practice hands on skills and be involved with direct patient care
- > Usually students are better able to work independently and are better prepared for residency
- Student housing may be provided by the host community, depending on availability

## **DISADVANTAGES**

- Limited sites, 6 sites for 2022-2023
- Site selection: Opportunity for 10 students with a single student site in Ortonville, MN, and Benson, MN
