Purpose: To provide education and experience in the care of patients in a rural community family medicine setting.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the student will be able to:

1. Demonstrate accurate and efficient oral presentations and thorough medical record documentations.
2. Demonstrate effective communication skills with patients and staff.
3. Formulate appropriate differential diagnoses.
4. Describe basic aspects of the “business of medicine”, such as national and local healthcare economics, patient and staff scheduling, office staff management, and billing and coding.
5. Perform basic procedures in the office setting and interpret basic laboratory, imaging, and pathology studies.
6. Discuss those experiences that bring satisfaction and joy in the daily practice of medicine

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

1. Medical care of all ages.
2. Addiction counseling and treatment.
3. Family healthcare delivery in a variety of patient settings including inpatient, outpatient, and nursing home.
4. Assisting the preceptor in the performance of procedures common to the outpatient practice of a family physician including mole removal/sutures/simple fracture care/joint injections and other typical family physician outpatient procedures.

Criteria for Grading: During and following this elective, the preceptor will:

1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
2. Evaluate by direct observation and provide feedback to the student regarding:
 - a. Data gathering practices
 - b. Communication skills
 - c. Documentation skills
 - d. Diagnostic reasoning skills
 - e. Procedural skills
 - f. Clinical management and patient education skills
