Purpose: To provide education and experience in the care of patients in a community family medicine setting.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate presentation and medical record documentation skills.
- 2. Demonstrate an ability to communicate effectively with patients and staff.
- 3. Demonstrate improved diagnostic acumen and ability to develop appropriate differential diagnoses.
- 4. Review important aspects of the business of medicine.
- 5. Demonstrate confidence in the evaluation and management of a variety of medical problems seen in the community family medicine clinical setting.

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Medical care for patients of all age groups.
- 2. Addiction counseling and treatment.
- 3. Patient care in a variety of patient settings including inpatient, outpatient, and nursing home care.
- 4. Clinical procedures including mole removal, sutures, simple fracture care, joint injections, and other typical family physician outpatient procedures.
- 5. Reading appropriate references and discussion with attending physician and peers.

Criteria for Grading: During and following this elective, the preceptor will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
- 2. Evaluate by direct observation the student's data gathering practices.
- 3. Evaluate by direct observation the student's communication and documentation skills.
- 4. Evaluate by direct observation the student's diagnostic reasoning skills.
- 5. Evaluate by direct observation the student's skill at conducting clinical procedures.
- 6. Evaluate by direct observation the student's clinical management and patient education skills.
