**Purpose:** To provide education and experience in the care of patients in a rural community family medicine setting.

## **Objectives:** Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Execute accurate and efficient oral presentations and thorough medical record documentations. (Phase 3 2, program 3.7)
- 2. Adopt effective communication skills with patients and staff including patient-centered patient education. (Phase 3 6, 7; Program 4.1, 4.2, 4.4)
- 3. Generate appropriate differential diagnoses. (Phase 3 3, program 3.3)
- 4. Summarize basic aspects of the "business of medicine", such as national and local healthcare economics, patient and staff scheduling, office staff management, and billing and coding. (Program 2.10)
- 5. Execute basic procedures in the office setting. (Program 3.6)
- 6. Demonstrate selection and interpretation of basic laboratory, imaging, and pathology studies. (Program 3.2, 3.3)
- 7. Choose to discuss those experiences that bring satisfaction and joy in the daily practice of medicine
- 8. Generate evidence-based treatment plans using the information available in the patient's presentation, past history, physical exam, differential diagnosis, and diagnostic studies. (Program 3.4)

## **Instructional Activities:** During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Medical care of all ages.
- 2. Addiction counseling and treatment, as available.
- 3. Family healthcare delivery in a variety of patient settings including inpatient, outpatient, and nursing home, as available.
- 4. Assisting the preceptor in the performance of procedures common to the outpatient practice of a family physician including mole removal/sutures/simple fracture care/joint injections and other typical family physician outpatient procedures.

## **<u>Criteria for Grading</u>**: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form. (This needs to be listed on each elective description.)
- 2. Evaluate by direct observation and provide feedback to the student regarding:
  - a. Data gathering practices (objective # 1)
  - b. Communication skills (objective # 2)
  - c. Documentation skills (objective # 1)
  - d. Diagnostic reasoning skills (objective # 3, 6)
  - e. Procedural skills (objective # 5)
  - f. Clinical management and patient education skills (objective #2, 8)
  - g. Ability to discuss the knowledge of the business of medicine and the experiences that bring satisfaction and joy to medicine (objectives # 4, 7)
