Purpose: To increase the student's knowledge and clinical skills in rheumatology.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Describe the common clinical features of rheumatologic disorders including musculoskeletal problems to rare connective tissue diseases as they present to practice
- 2. Present the elementary differential diagnosis of synovitis, vasculitis, and metabolic bone disease.
- 3. Interpret laboratory and radiologic studies and rheumatology.
- 4. Describe the relationship of rheumatology to general internal medicine and other subspecialties including the role of the consultant and assisting other practitioners

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Office and hospital evaluation of patients with rheumatic disease under direct supervision of a preceptor.
- 2. Selected readings and possible presentation of a seminar as directed by the preceptor.
- 3. Didactic sessions regarding the rheumatologic history and physical examination.
- 4. Evaluation of synovial fluid and tissue biopsies.
- 5. Radiologic interpretations relative to rheumatic diseases.
- 6. Completion of the teaching slide collection the American College Of Rheumatology.

<u>Criteria for Grading</u>: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
- 2. Directly observe and critique the student's ability to perform a history and physical examination, formulate a written work up, and discuss/defend the student's conclusions.
- 3. Directly observe and critique by discussions with the student, the student's knowledge of and ability to interpret basic radiology, pathology, and procedures relevant to rheumatology.
- 4. Review the student's demonstrated ability to pursue investigation of rheumatologic issues beyond the textbook level including use of literature review and alternative data sources.
- 5. Review the student's "360" communication skills.
- 6. Following the student's completion of the elective, the preceptor will complete the senior student elective form and submitted to the campus office.
