Purpose: To provide education and clinical experience in general pediatrics in a clinic setting with interdisciplinary partnerships as part of a pediatric medical home.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the student will be able to:

1. List, state or summarize as appropriate to the clinical situation an adequate knowledge base in general pediatrics. (competency 2.1, 2.3, 2.4, 2.7)
2. Execute improved history taking and physical assessment of infants and children and report and record this information in a concise manner. (competency 3.1, 3.7)
3. Demonstrate improved assessment skills in growth and psychomotor development in infants and children with typical and atypical growth and development. (competency 3.1, 3.3)
4. Identify appropriate laboratory and imaging studies and execute the process of placing orders in the electronic medical record. (competency 2.7, 3.2, 3.8)
5. Generate appropriate treatment plans for well-child and ill visits. (competency 3.4)
6. Summarize the utility of and choose to utilize the interdisciplinary resources and consult interdisciplinary partners in a pediatric medical home practice. (competency 7.3, 7.4, 7.5)
7. Complete individual learning objectives chosen by the student with the course director. (competency 1.1, 1.2, 1.3)

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

1. The formation of individual learning objectives for this elective under the guidance of the course director.
2. Preceptor or course director assigned clinical and didactic activities.
3. Outpatient care of the preceptors' patients with preceptor supervision.
4. Participation in team-based care with other disciplines, such as integrated behavioral health providers, pediatric medical home team members, therapists, RTs, nurses, social workers, in primary care pediatrics and in interdisciplinary clinic settings.

Criteria for Grading: During and following this elective, the preceptor will:

1. By direct observation of the student, discussion and evaluation of written work, evaluate the quality of the completed assignments and tasks relating to patient care (objective 1-5) .
2. By direct observation evaluate the quality of the discussions and oral presentations of the assigned preceptor's patient cases (objective 1, 2).
3. Evaluate the extent of meeting the student's own learning objectives for this elective (objective 7).
4. By direct observation of the student's performance in clinical settings evaluate their ability to describe the role of and utilize interdisciplinary resources (objective 6).
5. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
