Purpose: To provide education and experience in the care of adult patients requiring cardiology services.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Execute an accurate and detailed cardiac history (Competency 3.1).
- 2. Execute and generate an interpretation of an appropriate cardiovascular exam (Competency 3.1, 3.3).
- 3. Generate an appropriate diagnostic and treatment plan for patients with cardiac complaints or conditions (Competency 2.7, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4).
- 4. Successfully execute daily ward rounds and consultations (Competency 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4, 3.5)
- 5. Generate accurate written documentation for histories and physicals, daily progress notes, consultation notes and study interpretations (*Competency 3.7*)
- 6. Demonstrate the ability to interpret EKGs and stress EKGs at a level consistent with a fourth-year medical student (*Competency 3.3*).
- 7. Summarize the indications for stress tests and cardiac catheterization (Competency 2.5, 2.6).
- 8. Choose to communicate effectively in a "360" fashion with the medical team, patients and families (*Competency 3.7, 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 4.4, 4.8*).
- 9. Execute cardiac procedures with appropriate supervision (Competency 3.6).

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Cardiology hospital rounds and cardiology consultations.
- 2. Echocardiography laboratory including participation in the performance of stress echocardiography.
- 3. Cardiac catheterization laboratory (coronary and vascular).
- 4. ICU and CCU rounds.
- 5. Cardiology clinic.

<u>Criteria for Grading</u>: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
- 2. Evaluate through direct observation the student's skill at conducting ward rounds and consultations (Objective 1, 2, 3, 4).
- 3. Evaluate the student's ability to perform a cardiac consultation, make an appropriate diagnosis and suggest therapy following discussion with faculty (Objective 1, 2, 3, 4).
- 4. Evaluate through direct observation the student's ability to interpret EKGs (Objective 6).

- 5. Evaluate the student's knowledge of cardiology through discussions of selected patients, selected readings, and literature searches as directed by the preceptor (Objective 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7).
- 6. Evaluate the student's written material including progress notes, histories and physicals, consultation notes and study interpretation (*Objective 5*).
- 7. Evaluate through direct observation the student's ability to communicate in a "360°" fashion (Objective 8).
- 8. Evaluate through direct observation the student's skill in performing the procedures completed during the rotation. (Objective 9).
