Purpose: To develop a more advanced ability to evaluate and manage patients presenting with various psychiatric disturbances in the inpatient and outpatient settings.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Execute in patient evaluations with emphasis on the mental status examination and in establishing patient rapport (Competency 3.1).
- 2. Generate a satisfactory differential diagnosis utilizing DSM-V, with emphasis on psychotic, mood and anxiety disorders, substance abuse and dependence, delirium, dementia and personality disorders (Competency 3.3)
- 3. Identify appropriate utilization of a multidisciplinary treatment team, including appropriate use of laboratory and psychological testing (Competency 2.7, 3.2, 3.4).
- 4. Summarize knowledge of common psychotropic medications indications, mechanisms and side effects, with emphasis on antipsychotics, antidepressants, anxiolytics, and mood-stabilizing medications (Competency 2.4).
- 5. Summarize the concepts of transference, counter transference and the therapeutic alliance (Competency 4.7, 5.6, 5.8).

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Participate in presentations of inpatients in weekly interdisciplinary treatment team meetings.
- 2. Conduct daily rounds on hospitalized patients, if agreeable to psychiatric hospitalist.
- 3. Perform initial evaluations of new inpatients/consultations when feasible and appropriate.
- 4. Complete assigned readings.
- 5. Participate in assessment of new patients in outpatient/crisis clinic.
- 6. Work with clinic patients (children, adolescents, adults and geriatrics) as well as a deeper dive into clinical care of adolescents with severe and complex psychiatric pathology.

<u>Criteria for Grading</u>: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS Phase 3 elective evaluation form.
- 2. Determine by direct observation adequate performance of psychiatric diagnostic interviews and mental status examinations, whether dictated, in writing, or observed directly by the preceptor (objective 1).
- 3. Determine by direct supervision the student's ability to satisfactorily care for psychiatric patients including a basic understanding of the components of the bio-psycho-social treatment approach (objective 2,3).
- 4. Evaluate, by discussions, student's working knowledge of common psychotropic medications and the concepts of transference, counter-transference and the therapeutic alliance. (objective 4, 5).
- 5. Assessment of student's ability to work as part of the treatment team. (objective 3).
