Purpose: To provide education and experience in the care of patients requiring interventional radiology

services.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the student will be able to:

- 1. Effectively evaluate an interventional radiology (IR) patient to determine if he/she is an appropriate candidate for conscious sedation.
- 2. Identify the imaging modalities used in IR procedures and choose correctly, the modality for a given patient and procedure.
- 3. Interpret basic plain films, fluoroscopic images, angiographic images, ultrasounds, CT scans, MRI scans, and nuclear medicine scans used in evaluating and treating IR patients.
- 4. Identify appropriate indications for various IR procedures.
- 5. Perform image guided vascular access procedures under the supervision of a radiologist.
- 6. Evaluate and formulate management options in patients with peripheral vascular disease, venous disease and genitourinary tract disease from the perspective of an interventional radiologist.
- 7. Provide pre-procedure patient evaluation, post procedure care and follow up of patients requiring interventional radiology services.
- 8. Perform interventional radiology procedures related to peripheral vascular disease, venous disease and genitourinary tract disease under the supervision of a radiologist.
- 9. Perform image guided biopsies, aspirations, and/or drainages under the supervision of a radiologist.

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Reading the *Handbook of Interventional Radiologic Procedures* by Kandarpa and Aruny, fourth edition.
- 2. Direct and continuous educational contact with preceptor.
- 3. Observation of and participation in interventional radiology procedures. This would include all phases from receipt of the consult to post procedure patient visit.
- 4. Daily interpretive sessions in IR suite and CT suite.
- 5. Appropriate documentation (handwritten or dictated notes) of interactions with the patients seen during the elective.

Criteria for Grading: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Evaluate by direct observation the student's participation in clinical care of the patients.
- 2. Evaluate by direct observation the student's level of proficiency in diagnosis and treatment of interventional radiology patients.
- 3. Evaluate by direct observation the student's ability to perform an efficient history and physical exam and review the patient's medical record.
- 4. Evaluate by direct observation the student's ability to work as a member of an integrated health team.
- 5. Evaluate by direct observation the student's ability to present cases and integrate, assess, and learn new information
- 6. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
