Course Prerequisites: Completion of Surgery Clerkship **Revised Curriculum Phase(s):** 2 & 3

Purpose: Provide education and experience in the care of patients requiring anesthesia and/or pain management services in the outpatient setting.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the <u>student</u> will be able to:

- 1. Evaluate surgical patients to stratify operative risks including pediatric and geriatric patients.
- 2. Define the basics of general anesthesia, regional anesthesia and pain management techniques.
- 3. Assist the anesthesiologist in managing patients under anesthesia including airway, intravenous access, central lines, fluids, electrolytes, and acid base.
- 4. Describe the impact of anesthetic drugs on normal physiologic processes.
- 5. Complete a detailed preoperative assessment.

Instructional Activities: During this elective, <u>the student</u> will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Evaluating pre-surgical anesthetic and post-operative care of patients.
- 2. Performing standard techniques used to control postoperative pain under the supervision of the preceptor.
- 3. Performing local and regional anesthesia in the management of patients under the supervision of the preceptor.
- 4. Participating in focused discussion with the attending physician anesthesiologist regarding how altered physiologic disease states or specific surgical techniques affect the management of the anesthetized patients.

<u>Criteria for Grading</u>: During and following this elective, the <u>preceptor</u> will:

- 1. Evaluate by direct observation the student's skills in performing complete and accurate examination of the presurgical patient prior to administering anesthesia.
- 2. Evaluate by direct observation and feedback received from the surgical and nursing staff the student's professionalism and communication skills.
- 3. Evaluate by direct observation the student's ability to perform the skills involved in the administration of local and general anesthesia.
- 4. Utilize the standardized UNDSMHS senior elective evaluation form.
