Elective/Experience Title: Surgery Resident Readiness Curriculum

Department: Surgery

Location of Elective: UND Medical Education Center & Sanford Medical Center – Fargo, ND

Period(s) Offered: Period 10 only (Requires 60-day ADVANCE NOTICE prior to dropping this course)

Course Prerequisites: Completion of Surgery Clerkship

Number of students per period: Minimum 2 & Maximum 5 Revised Curriculum Phase(s): 3

Purpose: To prepare 4th year students who intend to enter a residency in a surgical field.

Objectives: Following successful completion of this elective, the student will be able to:

- 1. Generate accurate assessments and management plans for basic surgical problems. (Competency 3.1, 3.4)
- 2. Generate pre- and post-operative orders. (Competency 3.8)
- 3. Summarize the role of the PGY1 resident in the surgical team. (Competency 1.3)
- 4. Effectively adopt team member functions in critical situations. (Competency 3.5, 4.2, 4.3)
- 5. Execute basic surgical skills/ knots, tubes and lines, airway management and basic laparoscopic skills. (Competency 3.6)

Instructional Activities: During this elective, the student will be involved in/experience:

- 1. Basic surgical skills lab, placement of chest tubes, lines, and airway support, and basic laparoscopy.
- 2. Participate in clinical simulations of critical scenarios as a member of a multidisciplinary team.
- 3. Three weeks of didactics and simulation. This also includes 2 full days of ATLS training and certification. One-week rotation on a surgical teaching service.
- 4. Management of complex scenarios in hospital and in the simulation lab and writing pre- and post-operative orders.
- 5. Completion of assigned online American College of Surgeons modules.
- 6. Participation in an oral exam style discussion with course director.

Criteria for Grading: During and following this elective, the preceptor will:

- 1. Evaluate by direct observation the ability of the student to meet performance goals for manual skills set by the preceptor (objective 1, 2, 4, 5).
- 2. Evaluate through direct observation and testing at the end of the rotation knowledge of surgical skills learned during the rotation (objective 1,2,5).
- 3. Evaluate knowledge of surgery through an oral exam style discussion using the American Board of Surgery format (objective 1, 4).
- 4. Review Completion of online modules assignments provided by the American College of Surgeons (objective 1).
- 5. By discussion with the student and clinical and/or simulation assessment, evaluate their knowledge of the role of the intern on the surgical team (objective 3).
