



UND TRANSFER ADMISSION DETAILS NON-NDUS WCAMLS INSTITUTION INSTRUCTIONS CLASS OF 2025

Dear Western College Alliance Medical Laboratory Science (WCAMLS) Students currently attending one of the following: Bemidji State University, Montana State University-Billings, St Cloud State University, University of South Dakota, University Wisconsin-LaCrosse, University of Mary, or University of Jamestown

As you prepare for your last three semesters of study, one of the first things that need to be completed is apply for admission as a transfer student to the University of North Dakota (UND). It is encouraged that you begin this process as soon as possible as it may take a few weeks (up to 4-6 weeks) to have your application processed.

If you are currently taking an online course at UND in the Spring 2024, you may disregard this information as you have already been admitted to UND.

Some key information as you begin this process:

- You will pay your tuition at your home institution. In addition, review and/or verify your financial aid as this will be administered at your home institution.
- Upon successful completion of all coursework at UND in Summer 24, Fall 24, and Spring 25 terms your Bachelor degree will be awarded by your home institution and UND will award a certificate in MLS (CERT-MLS).
- Remember that you will also need to register for the appropriate clinical courses that your WCAMLS advisor indicates you need to register in for all upcoming semesters of study.
- All applications require a \$35 one-time admission application fee. Admissions will not begin processing your application until this is paid.

Steps to apply to UND as a transfer student:

1. Begin your online application as a transfer student visit:

2. Create an UND admissions account to access the online application form.
Academic Information = **2024 Summer**
3. Complete the UND Undergraduate Admissions Application.
When prompted select primary interest as **Medical Laboratory Science**.
4. Indicate the following information to be coded as a medical laboratory science student:
Choose: **ON CAMPUS**
Major/Program: **Medical Laboratory Science**
Degree Plan: **Certificate MLS**
Academic Term: **2024 Summer**
5. When prompted to best describe your current education goal at UND: **Earn a certificate**.

6. Submit **official Academic Transcripts of all College/Universities** that you have **attended**.

- Each institution you have attended should have directions on how to send an official transcript to another institution (UND).
- All official transcript(s) must be directly sent to the UND Undergraduate Admissions.

- Do not send your official transcripts to the UND Medical Laboratory Science program as these documents would be invalid and you would have to resubmit them (and possibly pay to resubmit your official transcripts) to UND Admissions.
- Request your official transcripts ASAP to allow ample time for your official transcript request(s) to be processed by each institution you attended.
- The process of requesting an official transcript varies among institutions. For quicker processing you may want to consider submitting official documents electronically or via next day mail. Each student is responsible for any fees that may be charged by non-UND institutions to submit an official transcript.
- If you have any questions/problems with the transfer application process, contact the Admissions office at 701-777-3000.

Upon admission to UND, you will be notified of your acceptance and receive a UND Student ID #. Once you are admitted to UND you are eligible to register courses. Course registration for Summer and Fall terms open in April 2024. Registration details and directions will be published on the UND MLS Website.
