In addition to the above requirements, you must complete **one** of the following options prior to entering the professional physical therapy program:

1. Complete a bachelor's **degree**.
2. UND Students: Complete ≥ 90 semester credit hours with the equivalent of an identified **minor** in a selected discipline.
3. UND or Transfer Students: Complete ≥ 90 semester credit hours with a **cognate** (i.e., area of concentration).
The cognate requires at least 20 hours in one discipline, with 8 of those hours at the 300 and/or 400 level(s).

As a student, **it is your responsibility** to make certain you have completed the pre-physical therapy curriculum, including pre-PT foundational science coursework, the Essential Studies requirements, and a degree or 90 semester credit hours with the equivalent of a minor or cognate. **Students must have successfully completed** all the above coursework and the credit hour requirements by the end of the spring semester of the year in which they are applying.

For selections purposes, grades from **only two retakes** will be used in the calculation of the science GPA. To further clarify, ANY course which is retaken for a grade constitutes one retake. In addition, to be considered in sGPA calculations, **retake grades must be posted** on the transcript by the end of the fall semester prior to selections.

Observation Hours: Prospective students are expected to complete at least 60 hours of observation prior to admission, 40 of which must be with a physical therapist. The experience may come in the form of observation, volunteer work, or paid employment. The applicant should keep a log of the number of hours completed, name and type of facility, supervisor's name, and types of patients observed.
