Kayla Olson, PA-C, was awarded Preceptor of the Year and Coal Country Community Health Center received Clinical Site of the Year. These awards were presented at the UND Department of Physician Assistant Studies Hooding Ceremony on May 12. Allison Obritsch, PA-C '23, who completed her clinical rotations with Olson and Coal Country Community Health Center, accepted the awards on the Center's behalf. Allison shared how welcoming the facility was to students to help them learn, grow, and prepare students for future practice. "Providers went out of their way to include me in a patient's care which is all one can hope for in a clinical site placement,"

Obritsch said. She continued to express her gratitude to Olson, who served as her primary preceptor, for all that she had done by pushing and challenging her in the best way possible and leading by example.

Class of 2024 Kathy Ohly Memorial Scholarship through the North Dakota Academy of Physician Assistants: Cayla Mahrer of Forman, N.D., and Lacey Zeiszler of Jamestown, N.D.

The Kathy Ohly Memorial Scholarship was established in 1994 in loving memory of Kathy Ohly, a very active member of NDAPA. Ohly graduated from the University of North Dakota Nurse Practitioner/ Physician Assistant Program in 1976 and was the president of the NDAPA from 1982-1984, where she chaired the Public Education Committee from 1987 to 1991 and the Bylaws Committee.

Kathy Ohly served on the Continuing Medical Education Committee from 1985 to 1987. Ohly served as one of the North Dakota representatives to the American Association of Physician Assistants House of Delegates during many national conventions. She organized and traveled with an orthopedic surgical team to Brazil to provide care for Brazilian children suffering from various orthopedic conditions. Her work in Brazil earned her the AAPA Humanitarian Award in 1987. She passed away on August 15, 1993, after a long and courageous battle with breast cancer.

Class of 2024 Daryl A. Sieg Memorial Scholarship through the North Dakota Academy of Physician Assistants: Chelsea Scheil of Faribault, Minn.

Daryl Sieg, assistant professor in the Department of Physician Assistant Studies, passed away suddenly on May 5, 2021.
