Dr. J. David Richardson is a native Kentuckian who received his M.D. from the University of Kentucky and did his general surgery and thoracic surgery residencies at the University of Texas in

San Antonio. Currently, he is Chief of Surgery and Director of Emergency Surgical Services at University Hospital, and Vice Chair of the Department of Surgery. He holds the endowed Berel L. Abrams, M.D., Chair of Surgery in the Department of Surgery at the University of Louisville School of Medicine. Dr. Richardson has held several of the most important positions in American surgery. He has served as President of the American Association for Surgery of Trauma, Southeastern Surgical Congress, Western Surgical Association, and the Southern Surgical Association. He has also served as Chair of the American Board of Surgery and Vice Chair of the Residency Review Committee for Surgery. In 2012, he served as Chair of the Board of Regents of the American College of Surgeons. In October 2015, he was named President of the American College of Surgeons.



The Edwin C. James Lectureship was established in honor of Edwin C. James, M.D., FACS (1932–1994); Professor and Chairman, UND Department of Surgery 1980–89; Dean, UND School of Medicine & Health Sciences 1988–93; and Founder of the UND Surgical Residency Program.
