

Pre-Requisite Courses

Pre-professional students will be advised to select a four-year course of study plan from a major of personal interest. Students will be advised by both their major department and will require advisement through the pre-professional occupational therapy advisor. The following illustrates a potential pre-professional course of study, which illustrates required pre-requisites for the OTD. Students need a minimum of 90 credit hours prior to admission. Students should ensure that at least 8 credits are from upper level (300 or 400 numbers) courses.
