Current Tuition and Fees

Tuition for the academic year 2022-23 is listed below, however, please note that tuition and fees are subject to change for the 2023-24 academic year based on legislative and state board of higher education guidelines. The tuition structure is determined by place of residence and is billed at a flat rate for all terms: fall, spring, and summer. Mandatory fees for the current academic year (also subject to change based on university policy) are billed at \$857.16 for each fall and spring, and summer semester at \$642.87.

Additional Projected Expenses (all are approximate costs and subject to change)

- Acknowledgement fee of \$500 (non-refundable); due upon acceptance to the program and applied towards tuition
- Background check after acceptance and annually thereafter ~\$55 each
 - Additional background checks or drug testing may be required by the program, clinical sites, and per SMHS policy.
- Books:
 - Pre-clinical phase (Yr 1) ~ \$1200
 - Clinical phase (Yr 2) ~ \$800
- Supplies, polling software, and clinical tracking/online testing proctor fees ~ \$500 (non-refundable)
- Computer technology ~ \$1625
 - software
 - printer/scanner
 - external hard drive
- Diagnostic equipment - Stethoscope ~ \$150 (more detailed information forthcoming)
- Student membership in AAPA – \$75
- Health Insurance varies, but on average is approximately \$4800/year. All students must have health insurance. More information for students looking for affordable options can be found on UND's [Student Health Services](#) website, or at healthcare.gov. Please note that the cost of plans varies due to individual needs.
- Immunization requirements and tuberculosis screenings – cost variable depending on student needs
- Potential for additional fees as part of referral for student services to include but not limited to counseling, health provider visits/services or disability processing
- Clinical sites: Dislocation costs for students to complete clinical practice experiences outside of their home area are the responsibility of the student and vary depending on geographic location and length of clinical practice experience. Individual sites have potential for additional costs if required:
 - drug testing
 - additional background check
 - additional health screenings/immunizations
 - fingerprinting
 - clinical placement fees if health care institution charges or utilizes a third- party clinical placement service
 - lab coats (the program provides 1 lab coat)
 - personal protective equipment (protective eyewear, face shield/mask, etc)

- Dislocation Costs for Didactic Sessions:
 - Lodging: \$1,000-\$2,200/4 week didactic. Didactic sessions are 1 week of orientation; 1 two-week session in the first fall; 2 four-week sessions in the first spring; another two-week session in the second fall; and a final 2-week session just before graduation for a total of 15 weeks on campus (\$3750-\$8250 total estimated expense)
 - Travel to and from didactics
 - Food
- Transportation and parking expenses
- Graduation expenses for photos and regalia
- Board review sessions/courses – optional and variable (not required by the program)
- National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistant (NCCPA) Examination Fee - \$550

Financial Aid and Scholarship Information

I. Applicants who have been accepted into the Physician Assistant Program may apply for financial aid through the Financial Aid Office at UND. Students may apply for federal financial aid, including the Federal Stafford (subsidized and/or unsubsidized) Loan.
