## WHAT IS THE STRONG HEART STUDY?

The Strong Heart Study (SHS) is a study of cardiovascular disease and its risk factors among American Indian men and women supported by the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI).

13 American Indian tribes and communities near Phoenix, Arizona, southwest Oklahoma and western and central North and South Dakota

Began in 1988 and is currently in Phase VII of the study

Largest, longest longitudinal study in the U.S. of heart disease and its risk factors in individuals with diabetes

### STRONG HEART STUDY PROCESS....

- Propose a paper or thesis
- Reviewed by SHS and Publications and Presentations Committee
- Once approved, submit a request for SHS data (with Data Use Request)
- SHS analyst creates de-identified dataset
- Once data is analyzed and manuscript is written IHS IRB and tribal health boards approval is required
